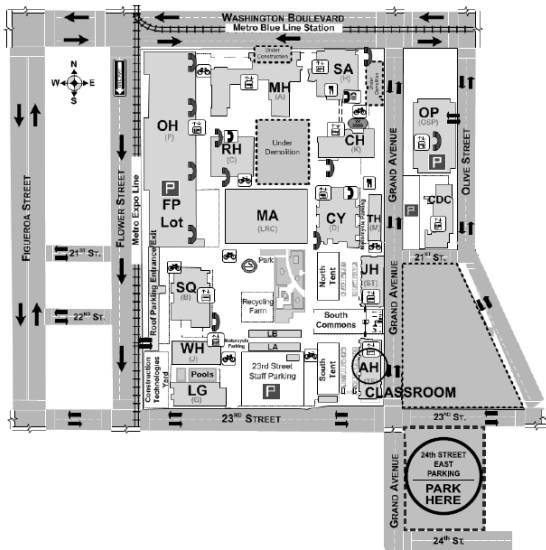

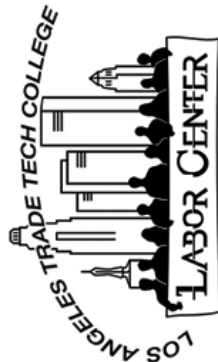

Deogracia Cornelio has been the Director of Education at the UCLA Labor Occupational Safety and Health (LOSH) Program since 2005. She has over 30 years of experience in the areas of social service and social research, including popular education, participatory research and other methods to advance social justice. Her work focuses on gender, race and class differences and their impact in interpersonal and intergroup communication, culture and knowledge production.



Hector Flores has been with UCLA-LOSH as a Program Coordinator and Bilingual Educator since 2015. He coordinates the Worker Occupational Safety and Health Training Education Program (WOSHTEP), the OSHA Susan Harwood Training Grant, and leads in developing the WOSH Specialist and trainers' network. In these roles, Hector works towards developing worker health and safety programs through collaboration with a variety of labor, community, labor-management, and employer partners.
